An update from the Environment Trust **River Centre project team**

Since our Spring 2009 update we've been very busy bringing forward plans for Twickenham's most exciting new attraction. Our team of staff, volunteers and specialist advisers has been working with great flair, imagination and commitment to plan the interior of the River Centre as well as planning and starting the delivery of education and other activities for it.

In March, the winning team of architect and developer for the project was announced. Well-known local architect Clive Chapman, along with Countryside Properties, were chosen to design and build the River Centre, new landscaped open space and housing on a revitalised Riverside.

It's easy to see what life the River Centre will bring to the Twickenham Riverside in three summers time. There will be a buzzing hub of activity on and by our beautiful river, with eating and drinking outside and in the café restaurant, and kids running freely in the boat-themed playground or exploring the nature garden. There'll be a stunning river ecology exhibition and aquarium attracting visitors from the area and further afield, and learning activities ranging from sustainability forums for adults to boat building qualifications for youngsters.

I was enormously impressed by the commitment of local environmental and amenity groups to proceed with the River Centre. The Centre, with its boat-house, learning area and exhibitions will be a major addition to the borough; and a focal point for 'green' organisations to pursue an environmental agenda. What the team thinks **about the scheme:**

- The position of the River Centre under the rising grassed open space is an ingenious idea, providing a large informal public lawn connected to the play area and including a new vantage point for viewing the river.
- The River Centre is an innovative but practical building, with flexible internal spaces, river views and easy access from street level for boats and people. It is designed to make best use of solar energy and will be a demonstration teaching aid for sustainable building.
- The café/restaurant and play area are ideally sited to be used together, above the flood level and with sunny open views to the river. The play area is a mini boatyard, providing learning about boatbuilding and ecology and will be fun for a wide range of ages.
- The flats and houses at the rear of the site are of mixed sizes and values.

do not appear exclusive, and are integrated with the street pattern and the open space, creating a new square for the town that encloses new public open space.

• The freeing of a large part of the waterfront from parked cars will integrate the wide embankment into the public open space, and access to the river will be easier via a new pontoon. The embankment will be landscaped and provide a revitalised riverfront for Twickenham, ideal for public events and fairs.

Next steps for the **River Centre...**

- The Environment Trust has been stepping up its environmental education activities over the year. A programme of adult courses was launched successfully this spring and a larger programme will be run this autumn. The number of projects and activities with the borough's schools continues to grow. Plans are also being put in place for a new environmental NVQ course for young people and adults.
- Funding events for the development stage of the River Centre project are continuing with the support of our patron Sir David Attenborough. Funding plans for the fit-out of the building are being put in place for submission following planning.
- The Trust is working on a full update to the Business Plan. The current version and various update reports are available at www.rivercentre.org.uk
- The Trust is working with the developer to agree the River Centre specification for a Detailed Planning Application.
- Detailed design and construction will follow in 2010, subject to planning permission.

What else

is the Environment Trust doing?

At our AGM in June 2009 the Trust secured the support of over 80% of members to expand its objects to include the protection and conservation of the physical and natural environment and, importantly, to deliver education about these issues. This paves the way for us to continue developing our role as the borough's green champion, harnessing the skills needed to run the River Centre's diverse programme of activities.

The **Schools Environment Forum** held in May 2009 at Pembroke Lodge received very positive feedback from the teachers and governors of the 38 local schools attending. Delegates were treated to a workshop by Garden Organic, the UK's leading organic growing charity, had an opportunity to meet environmental organisations willing to work with their schools, and heard some inspiring presentations packed full of practical ideas for running environmental projects in schools.

The Trust also supports the Sustainability Days partnership project between Richmond Environment Network and the council, a cross-curricular day of
